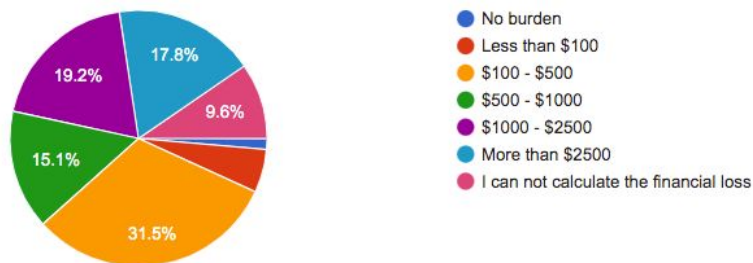


## Survey Summary:

Based on answers from 75 student participants, the average monthly **rent for students is \$910, plus \$158 average monthly utility costs**. 17.3% participants had to relocate from New Haven because of Covid-19. The average **financial burden for these relocations was \$650**. The average projected moving cost for second years planning to move from New Haven after graduation is **\$1,790**. The average cost students have already experienced from **securing a strong internet connection at home since the implementation of the online curriculum is \$92**. The average current and projected unexpected **costs resulting from the closure of the studios and facilities is \$597**. The average **non-education related additional costs** students have experienced so far because of Covid-19 (e.g having to provide family support) is **\$658**. The monthly average **current and projected loss of income** students are experiencing because of Covid-19 is **\$1,169**.

Below is more information regarding current first year student's expected participation if a virtual curriculum is implemented in the fall of 2020:

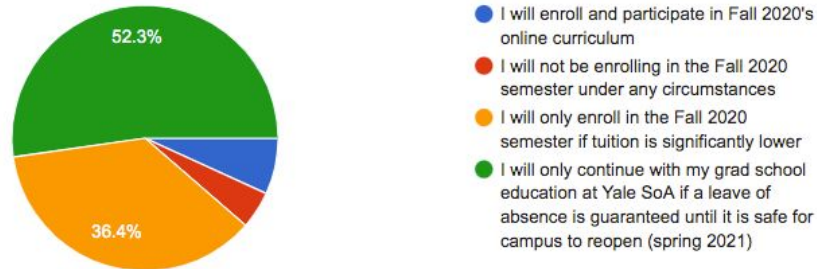

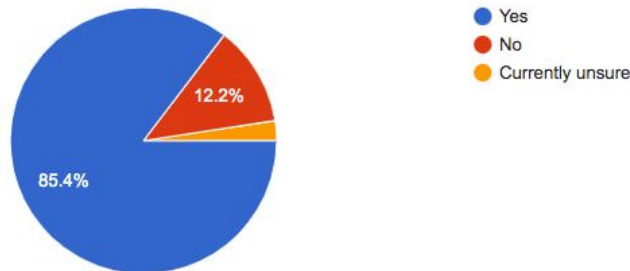
First-years only: What will be your level of participation if Yale SoA continues with an online curriculum through the fall?
